Individual data on persons directly and/or indirectly affected by a crime against society, such as pornography, is not collected.






Drug/Narcotic Arrests by Age in 2008


2008 Drug/Narcotic Violations

Drug/Alcohol Usage in 2008






**Adult Drug/Narcotic Arrests

These offenses are categorized under two types of criminal activity: 1) Prostitution, which is to unlawfully engage in sexual relations for profit. 2) Assisting/promoting prostitution, which is defined as to solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution.






