This letter is to confirm that the Commonwealth of Virginia now grants recognition of enhanced concealed handgun permits issued by the State of Idaho. This recognition is, of course, subject to any changes in the laws of either jurisdiction.

A copy of current Virginia laws which will bind Idaho residents carrying in Virginia may be accessed through the Virginia State Police website at www.vsp.state.va.us. That website includes both a link to the applicable Virginia Code sections as well as general guidance regarding the carrying of concealed weapons in Virginia.


