RE: Reciprocity for Concealed Weapon Permits

Dear Ms. Altig:

Thank you for your recent inquiry regarding reciprocity for concealed weapon permits.

California law does not address reciprocity for concealed weapon (CCW) licenses, and it does not recognize CCW licenses issued in other states. Consequently, an Idaho resident with a valid Idaho concealed handgun permit may not carry a concealed weapon in California. In addition, California law does not authorize the Attorney General to enter into reciprocity agreements with other states for the recognition of CCW licenses.

It is generally illegal to carry a concealed firearm in California. (Pen. Code, § 25400.) Only individuals with CCW licenses issued by a county sheriff, chief of police, or other head of a municipal police department may lawfully carry concealed and loaded weapons. (Pen. Code, § 25655.) Police chiefs and county sheriffs may only issue CCW permits to persons who reside in the city or county where the police chief or sheriff has jurisdiction. (Pen. Code, § 26155, subd. (a)-(b).) Thus, an Idaho resident would not be eligible to receive a concealed carry permit in California.

California law does, however, authorize a citizen of the United States over the age of 18 years who is not prohibited by law from possessing a firearm, and who is temporarily in California, to transport by motor vehicle any pistol, revolver, or other firearm capable of being concealed upon the person if the firearm is unloaded and in a locked container. (Pen. Code, §§ 16850, 25610.)
