Re: *Concealed Carry Permit Reciprocity*

Dear Mr. Spoden:

This letter is in response to your letter of January 5, 2011, regarding concealed carry permit reciprocity.

Under IDAHO CODE § 18-3302(12)(g), any person who has a valid concealed weapons permit from a state or local law enforcement agency or court authorizing him to carry a concealed weapon is not required to obtain a concealed weapons permit from an Idaho county sheriff. However, the permit issued in another state will only be considered valid in Idaho if the permit is in the permit holder's physical possession.

Therefore, based on IDAHO CODE § 18-3302(12)(g), you may consider this letter documentation of reciprocity of concealed carry permits between the state of Colorado and the state of Idaho.


