Dear Ms. Altig,

We have received your letter dated July 1, 2013, requesting that the state of Indiana consider entering into a reciprocity agreement with the state of Idaho in order to recognize Idaho's Enhanced Concealed Weapons License. I write simply to inform you that no reciprocity agreement is necessary under Indiana law.

Indiana Code Section 35-47-2-21(b) states that "[l]icenses to carry handguns, issued by other states or foreign countries, will be recognized according to the terms thereof but only while the holders are not residents of Indiana." In short, Indiana recognizes all out-of-state handgun licenses so long as the person possessing the out-of-state license is not a resident of the state of Indiana. And, obviously, out-of-state license holders are subject to Indiana law while within Indiana's borders.

I presume this statutory recognition satisfies your request for reciprocity. I have attached the sheet you sent in your request memorializing this as well. If you do have any further questions, please feel free to contact me.
