Dear Ms. Altig:

Effective December of 2012, the State of North Carolina recognizes all valid concealed carry permits from all states regardless of whether that state will recognize the North Carolina concealed carry permit. Our state statute does not require a formal reciprocity agreement in order for reciprocity to exist. Therefore, the State of North Carolina will recognize concealed carry permits from Idaho as long as the permit is valid in the State of Idaho.

Please let me know if you require any additional information in order for your state to recognize North Carolina concealed carry permits.

Dear Mr. Askins:

Thank you for your letter of May 7, 2014. I write in order to clarify something that I don't think I made very clear in my letter to you of April 11, 2014.

As I mentioned in my letter, as with North Carolina, Idaho's Attorney General is also required by law to inquire whether other states recognize a valid Idaho concealed weapons license. You will receive a mailing from Idaho for this purpose sometime shortly after July 1, 2014. That is the mailing package that will include the form that North Carolina can fill out and return to Idaho, copies of Idaho's concealed weapons license statutes, and samples of what Idaho concealed weapons licenses (original and enhanced) look like. If you need any of these materials sooner than that, please let me know and I will send them along right away.
