Dear Ms. Altig,

We have received your letter of July 1, 2015 regarding Idaho's concealed weapons licenses and reciprocity between the States of Idaho and Nebraska.

Since 2009, the State of Nebraska has recognized "original" (3302) concealed weapons licenses issued by the State of Idaho, and since 2013, Nebraska has recognized "enhanced" (3302K) licenses. The recent changes to Idaho law highlighted in your letter do not appear to affect Nebraska's recognition of either of Idaho's licenses. Nebraska will continue to recognize both "original" (3302) and "enhanced" (3302K) concealed weapons licenses.

There are, however, limits to such recognition. The State of Nebraska will only recognize permits issued to persons 21 years of age or older, and recognition of other states' concealed weapons permits is limited to the carrying of a concealed handgun. Unlike Idaho, Nebraska law does not authorize the concealed carrying of any weapon other than a handgun.
