

For reporting purposes under the UCR/NIBRS rules and guidelines, all victims of crimes against society are classified as “society” victims. Individual data on persons directly and/or indirectly affected by a crime against society, such as pornography, is not collected.




Definition



Drug/Narcotics Violations 5 Year Trend



- 0.4% increase from last years' suspected drug and/or alcohol usage during the commission of Group "A" incidents.


Drug/Alcohol Usage in 2003






**Adult Drug/Narcotic Arrests

Definition

- Unlawfully bet or wager money or something else of value; assist, promote, or operate a game of chance for money or some other stakes; possess or transmit wagering information; manufacture, sell, purchase, possess, or transport gambling equipment, devices, or goods; or tamper with the outcome of a sporting event or contest to gain a gambling advantage -

These offenses are categorized under two types of criminal activity: 1) Prostitution, which is to unlawfully engage in sexual relations for profit. 2) Assisting/promoting prostitution, which is defined as to solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution.

Definition




49.3% of the weapons identified in weapon law violations were firearms, of which 9.8% were classified as automatic.

Weapon Law Arrests by Age in 2003


