OJJDP FY 2011 TA Program to Address Commercial Sexual Exploitation/Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking

This Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) program will support an organization and/or a consortium of organizations to provide technical assistance to OJJDP grantees and other organizations addressing commercial sexual exploitation (CSE) or domestic minor sex trafficking (DMST) of girls and boys. The program will offer education and training, expert consultations, peer-to-peer networking opportunities, resources, and other tailored assistance to effectively respond to diverse communities addressing the sexual victimization of girls and boys.

Deadline: July 5, 2011.

Eligibility: Nonprofit and for profit organizations, institutions of higher education.

Funds: Up to \$450,000. Project period: 12 months.

BJA FY 11 Prison Industry Enhancement Certification Technical Assistance Program (PIETAP)

The Prison Industry Enhancement Certification Program (PIECP) was created to encourage states and counties to establish employment opportunities for inmates that approximate those found in the private sector. States or counties participating in the program must have statutory authority to administer prison industry projects. The primary purpose of the technical assistance program, PIECTAP, is to provide assistance to entities that hold PIECP certificates and to entities interested in applying for PIECP certificates. Applicants should anticipate that this project will entail assisting up to 50 PIECP certificate holders within state and local governmental agencies nationwide. Currently there are 39 state and 5 county-based certified

correctional industry programs (a total of 44 PIECP certificate holders), with 191 business partnerships or CACs.

Deadline: July 7, 2011.

Eligibility: National for profit and nonprofit organizations.

Funds: Up to \$225,000. Project period: 18 months.

BJA FY 11 Prison Rape Elimination Act: Demonstration Projects to Establish "Zero Tolerance" Cultures for Sexual Assault Program

The PREA Program provides funding to state and local governments and federally recognized tribes for demonstration projects within confinement settings including adult prisons and jails; juvenile facilities; community corrections facilities; law enforcement lockups and other temporary holding facilities; and tribal detention facilities. Applicants must successfully communicate a comprehensive approach to the prevention, detection, and response to the incidence of sexual abuse and clearly prioritize gaps which are as of yet unaddressed, either programmatically or through changes in policy and procedures, as it relates to implementation of the PREA standards.

Deadline: July 7, 2011.

Eligibility: States, local and tribal units of government.

Funds: Up to \$600,000. Project period: 36 months.

BJA FY 11 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program State Solicitation

The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. The JAG Program provides states

and units of local governments with critical funding necessary to support a range of program areas including law enforcement, prosecution and court programs, prevention and education programs, corrections and community corrections, drug treatment and enforcement, crime victim and witness initiatives, and planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs.

Deadline: July 14, 2011.

Eligibility: States.

Funds: Formula-based. Project period: up to four years.

BJA FY 11 Violent Gang and Gun Crime Reduction Program (Project Safe Neighborhoods)

Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN) is designed to create safer neighborhoods through a sustained reduction in crime associated with gang and gun violence. The program's effectiveness is based on the cooperation of local, state, and federal agencies engaged in a unified approach led by the U.S. Attorney (USA) in each of the 94 federal judicial districts. Each USA is responsible for establishing a collaborative PSN task force of federal, state, and local law enforcement and other community members to implement gang and gun crime enforcement, intervention and prevention initiatives within the district. Through the PSN task force, each USA will implement the five design features of PSN partnerships, strategic planning, training, outreach, and accountability to address specific gun and gang crime problems in that district.

Deadline: July 21, 2011.

Eligibility: The PSN task force must identify a fiscal agent for the district. Eligible fiscal agents include states, units of local government, educational institutions, faith-based and other community organizations, and private nonprofit organizations.

Funds: Formula-based. Project period: 24 months.

JAG-funded projects may address crime through the provision of services directly to individuals and/or communities and by improving the effectiveness and efficiency of criminal justice systems, processes, and procedures.

Eligibility: Units of local government on the FY 2011 JAG Allocations List.

Funds: Formula-based. Project period: up to four years.
